ADDENDUM TO MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

State of Maine Judicial Branch
And

Department of Behavioral and Developmental Services – Office of Substance Abuse

This Addendum is made this 1st day of October, 2005, by and between the State of Maine Judicial Branch, hereinafter called “Judicial Branch”, the Department of Behavioral and Developmental Services – Office of Substance Abuse, hereinafter called “OSA”, for the period of October 1, 2005, to September 30, 2006.

This Addendum supplements the original Memorandum of Agreement made October 1, 2002, to September 30, 2003; continued for the period October 1, 2003, to September 30, 2004; continued for the period October 1, 2004 to September 30, 2005; and which is renewed for the period of October 1, 2005, to September 30, 2006, intact except for the changes specified in this Addendum.

SPECIFICATIONS OF SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED**I. AGREEMENT SUMMARY**

The description of the delivery of substance abuse services for the comprehensive substance abuse treatment model component of the Judicial Branch’s Family Treatment Drug Court (FTDC) remains the same as detailed in the original Memorandum of Agreement.

II. DEFINITION OF SPECIFIC TREATMENT COMPONENT**A. Family Treatment Drug Court Client Services**

OSA has designated one qualified treatment provider, Choice/Skyward, serving the three county region of Waldo, Knox, and Lincoln Counties, and one qualified treatment provider, Kennebec Valley Mental Health Center, serving Kennebec County, to provide timely evaluation and comprehensive treatment services to FTDC clients. Evaluations will be scheduled within one week of the referral. Treatment will commence immediately upon completion of the evaluation, if indicated.

OSA and its subcontractors will participate in the development of, and training in, a pilot comprehensive, transdisciplinary, biopsychosocial evaluation that includes substance abuse, domestic violence, mental health, and child maltreatment evaluation components.

Modalities of treatment will be based on best practices and reflect evidence-based research, including Motivational Enhancement Therapy, cognitive-behavioral therapies, and family therapies. OSA, working with the Judicial Branch, will provide technical assistance and training and draw on key ingredients from evidence-based treatments to design a treatment services model appropriate to a family treatment drug court and to the client families. The treatment model will incorporate co-occurring disorders and domestic violence treatment components. It will have a trauma education component and

a burnout prevention component. Protocols from relevant CSAT publications will be incorporated.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Remain unchanged from the original Memorandum of Agreement.

FUNDING AND PAYMENT PROVISIONS

A. Source of Available Funds

Wraparound Services Model for Maine's Family Treatment Drug Court Grant
(CFDA# 93.243)

The sum of \$71,000 shall be furnished by the Judicial Branch from funds provided by the Federal Government.

Payments will only be made after the Judicial Branch is in receipt of the appropriate quarterly narrative and financial reports from OSA.

B. Payment Schedule

Subject to the availability of funds and other terms of this agreement, payments will be made to OSA on the basis and frequency indicated below:

OSA will receive payment from the Judicial Branch on or about the fifteenth (15th) of the month in accordance with the following payment schedule:

October, 2005 – December, 2005	One payment of \$17,750 in January, 2006
January, 2006 – March, 2006	One payment of \$17,750 in April, 2006
April, 2006 – June, 2006	One payment of \$17,750 in July, 2006
July, 2006 – September, 2006	One payment of \$17,750 in October, 2006 adjusted for the quarterly fiscal report due Oct. 15, 2006.

Total payment not to exceed \$71,000.

The Judicial Branch may recall funds from the provider when the provider, or its subcontractors, fails to meet minimum performance standards as specified in Specifications of Services Provided.
